100 YEARS OF AVIATION IN WESTLAND TO BE CELEBRATED OVER EXTENDED WAITANGI WEEKEND -FEBRUARY NEXT YEAR

A small group comprising representatives of Destination Westland, Destination Hokitika, Heritage Hokitika and the Hokitika Aero Club has been coordinating a series of events over Waitangi weekend to recognise the centenary of the first flight on the West Coast - Captain Maurice Buckley from Christchurch took off from Hokitika Beach on the 30th of December 1923 in his Avro 504k biplane. The represented the beginning of a remarkable 100 years of aviation in Westland, including the first licensed schedule air service in New Zealand - Captain Bert Mercer's Air travel (NZ) Ltd. airline which commenced operation in December 1934.

Planned events during Waitangi weekend include:

A fly-in of recreational aircraft to Hokitika from throughout New Zealand, Saturday 3rd to Tuesday 6th February with aircraft on display and various activities based at the airport. This event has been organised by the Hokitika Aero Club.

A visit to Hokitika by a de Havilland DH9 Dominie. This is the actual aircraft used on the South Westland Air Service in the 1950's, now based at Croydon Aerodrome in Southland. It is hoped that joy rides will be available to the public from Saturday 3rd to Monday 5th February.

An evening of aviation history and reminiscences at Hokitika's Regent Theatre on Saturday 3rd February, with presentations by prominent aviation historians Rev Dr Richard Waugh QSM and Bishop Stephen Lowe, (both raised in Hokitika), followed by a panel discussion with a line up of Westland aviators.

Historic aviation documentaries are to be shown on the big screen at the Regent, schedule to be announced. A re-enactment of the first flight to Franz Josef Glacier/ South Westland in January 1924 is planned as part of the recreational aircraft fly-in event.

A new aviation display is to be launched at the Westland Industrial Heritage Park on Saturday 3rd February.
